
To whom it may concern:

LNG Canada is a joint venture company comprised of Shell, PetroChina, Mitsubishi Corporation and Kogas which is proposing to build and operate a liquefied natural gas export terminal located in the traditional territory of the Haisla First Nation, in the District of Kitimat, British Columbia.

LNG Canada will be the single largest private energy infrastructure investment in Canadian history should it proceed. We have enjoyed strong support from local communities and First Nations as we progress the project to a final investment decision which we hope will be made by our joint venture participants should the project prove affordable and globally cost competitive.

In working closely with communities around the LNG plant including Kitimat, Terrace and the Regional District of Kitimat Stikine as well as the communities along the proposed Coastal Gas Link pipeline corridor, we are very familiar with the NW Regional Benefits Alliance (RBA) and their mandate to ensure a prosperous and sustainable future for their communities. LNG Canada shares this ambition and while LNG Canada will continue to address social and infrastructure impacts through its Community Level Infrastructure and Services Management Plan (CLISMP), it supports the RBA initiative to work with industry and government to establish more effective ways to address the region's current social services and infrastructure requirements. We look forward to playing a role in these discussions going forward.
